Working for a greener Goldsmid all year round

Labour has delivered on its pledge at the last election to roll out kerbside recycling to the whole of Goldsmid Ward in Hove. Recycling rates are now up to 27 per cent, one of the highest in the country.

"The City Council has now introduced kerbside collections to the whole of Brighton and Hove where possible," says Goldsmid Councillor Vince Meegan.

Labour's Melanie Davis believes more can be done to reach and exceed the City's target of recycling 35 per cent of household waste by next year.

"We can recycle over half of our household waste," she says. "Green issues are at the top of Labour's local agenda in Goldsmid. The next step is to ensure that people who live less accessible properties can recycle." There are 25 new blocks of flats coming on-stream this year, for details call 294754.

Alun Jones urges people to go green by investing in other ways to reduce the amount of waste we produce: "Residents can now buy cut-price composters, wormeries and water butts. Contact us and we will let you know how," he says.
